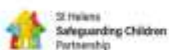

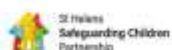




Dear Parents and Carers,

We are all very hopeful that this term we will begin to see a reduction in pupil absences due to Covid. (guidance is now that any children testing positive for Covid should be absent from school for 3 days and only remain absent after that time if they remain unwell with a prolonged high temperature). Our children have already missed so much time in school, learning and missing valuable time with friends and experiences, that it is more important than ever that they are in school every day, and on time. With this in mind, please can I remind you of the absence reporting arrangements available to you. Our absence reporting is part of our school safeguarding procedures and it is crucial that you always report your child's absence in advance and via the correct method. Please do not message any staff member via Class Do Jo to report a child's absence. Message may be missed first thing each morning when teachers are preparing lessons and will not be checking Do Jo at this time. All absences must be reported to the school office staff. 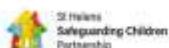

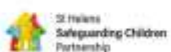

Attendance April 2022

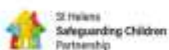
